Where to come

Locations:

RYA Sailing/Recreational Courses are taught at Hodge Howe, Windermere School's lakeside watersports centre. Please drop off and collect your child from this location. If your child is attending Breakfast Club please drop them at Browhead Campus.

Directions:

From the M6 Northbound and Southbound:

- Leave the M6 at junction 36 and join the A590 towards Kendal
- Just before Kendal, leave the A590 and join the A591 Kendal by-pass towards Windermere and Kendal.
- Continue into Windermere passing the Windermere Hotel. The Junior School, Elleray Campus is located on the right hand side, after the traffic lights, but do not stop here.
- For Hodge Howe, continue along the road to the next roundabout - take immediate left once you are leaving the roundabout - at the stone gateposts marked 'Hodge Howe'. Continue to the bottom of the drive (through the open gate)
- For the Senior School campus at Browhead, turn right at the roundabout onto the A592. The school is on the right, about one mile up.

Course timings

AM courses (RYA Level 1 and 2): 10am to 1pm.

PM courses ((RYA Level 3 onwards): 1.30pm to 4.30pm

For all sailing courses, please drop off your child **15 minutes before the indicated start time** to ensure a prompt start.

What to bring?

The weather in the Lake District can be changeable and may range from warm to cold, dry to wet, often on the same day. Please ensure your child brings a change of warm clothes, spare socks and a dry pair of shoes each day.

It is essential that suitable footwear is worn; wetshoes are ideal but an old pair of trainers that you don't mind getting wet will be fine.

All sailors **MUST** bring the following, whatever the weather:

- Fleece jacket
- Swimwear
- Sun cream and sunhat
- A full change of warm, dry clothes
- Spare socks
- A dry pair of shoes
- An old towel to use during the course
- Your own snacks and hot drinks
- A large plastic or waterproof bag to store everything in

What to expect

Our sailing groups have a maximum ratio of 1 instructor to 6 students.

All students are required to wear a buoyancy aid at all times when on the Lake and must follow the instructions given by the sailing instructors. They may be required to wear additional safety equipment, such as a helmet, if deemed necessary by the Senior Sailing Instructor.

It can be cold out on Lake Windermere. Our sailing instructors will work with the group to ensure all pupils feel safe, confident and happy on the Lake.

Weather

In the unlikely event that no sailing is possible due to the weather/wind (too much or too little), alternative activities offered will be kayaking or canoeing. In the event that no watersports can take place safely, we will escort the students by school minibus to the Sports Hall at Browhead for alternative activities. In this case you should collect your children from the School Sports Hall (signposted off Patterdale Road).

COVID-19 information

It is imperative that Windermere School complies with all relevant government and RYA guidelines and restrictions. Your co-operation and understanding with the following points is essential to allow us to proceed with the courses.

1. To allow for better social distancing, we have restricted the number of students attending the course to 18. There will be 3 instructors each day.
2. Access to the Pavilion is permitted for use of toilet facilities only. A mask must be worn when in the Pavilion.
3. No parents are permitted in the Pavilion, for collection/drop off, please use the grassed area (maintaining social distancing) or wait in your car.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club starts at 8am at Browhead Campus. Please drop off your child at the front door, they will be bussed down to Hodge Howe after breakfast for the start of their course.
