Serena Cooper



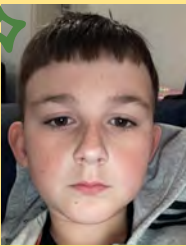
This term I have taken the opportunity to organise new events for the Senior Council and decide where I'm going to apply to university.

Luana Kenny



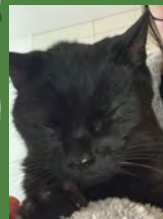

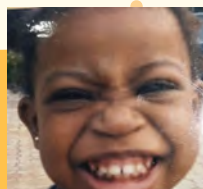

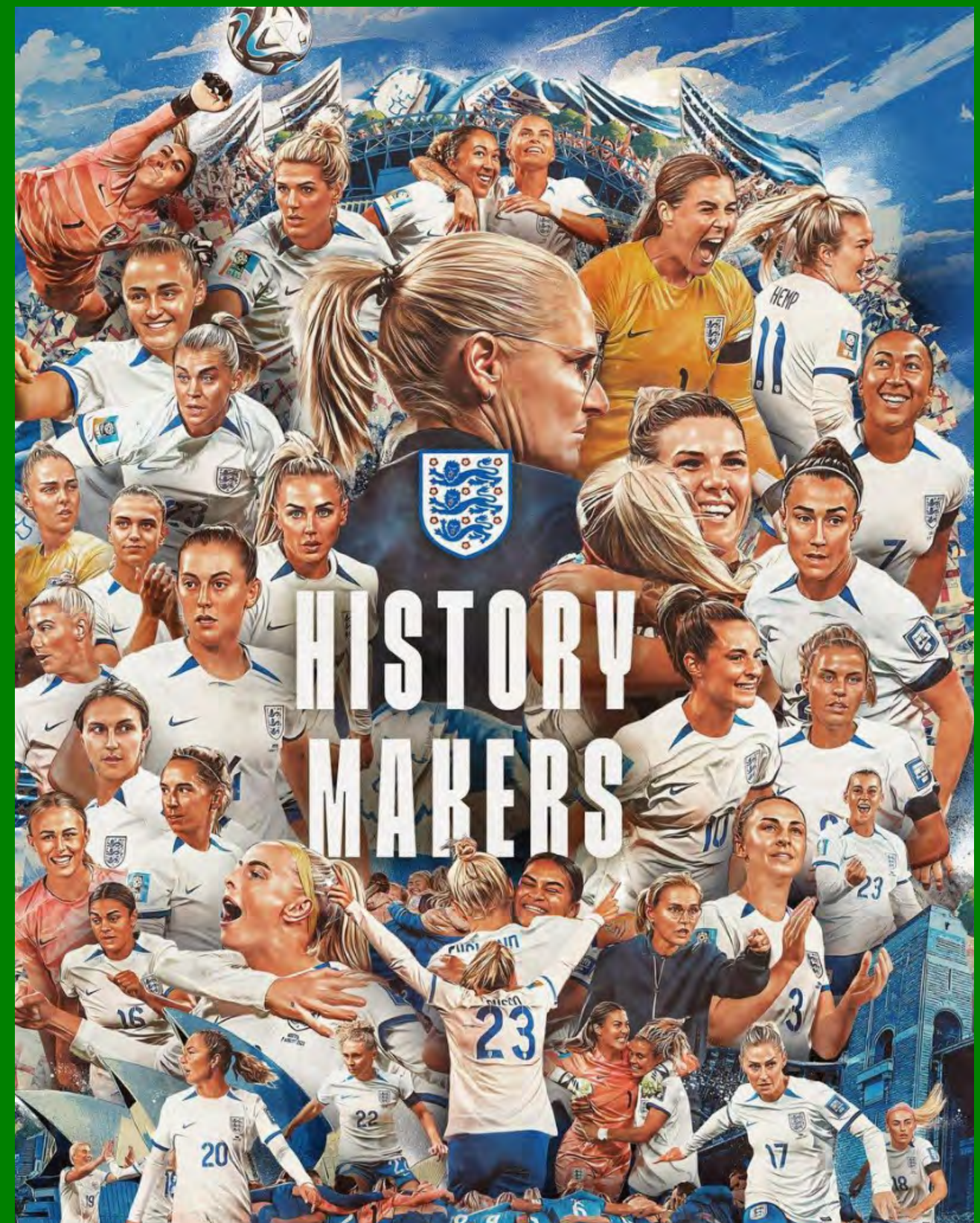


RECORDS BROKEN DURING THE WOMEN'S WORLD CUP

LIONESSES REACH THE FINAL

The Lionesses did not bring the trophy home however, they still made it to the final for the first time. It is the only time that an England team, men and women have reached the final since 1966.



MOST ATTENDED WOMEN'S SPORT GAME

This year, the Women's World Cup became the most attended women's sporting event ever. They had almost two million fans attending the Australia and New Zealand matches. This is higher than the 600,000 attendants at the 2019 tournament in France.



UK'S MOST WATCHED WOMEN'S MATCH

The next record that was set was that the Women's World Cup was the UK's most watched women's game with an average of 13.3 million TV viewers.

This is the next biggest TV audience since the King's coronation in May, which had over 18 million viewers.



CASEY PHAIR

OLDEST AND YOUNGEST PLAYERS IN THE WOMEN'S WORLD CUP.

Playing for South Korea 16 year-old Casey Phair broke the record for the youngest player in the women's World Cup.



CAPTAIN WITH THE MOST TOURNAMENTS

Canada's Christine Sinclair increased her record as the Captain with the most World Cup tournament after Playing in 6 competitions.

SALMA PARALLUELO



Salma Paralluelo is the first player in the Men's and Women's World Cup, to be a champion at under-17, under-20 and senior level. As well as playing on the winning team at this year's tournament, she also won the FIFA under-20 Women's World Cup in 2022 & the FIFA under-17 Women's World Cup in 2018.

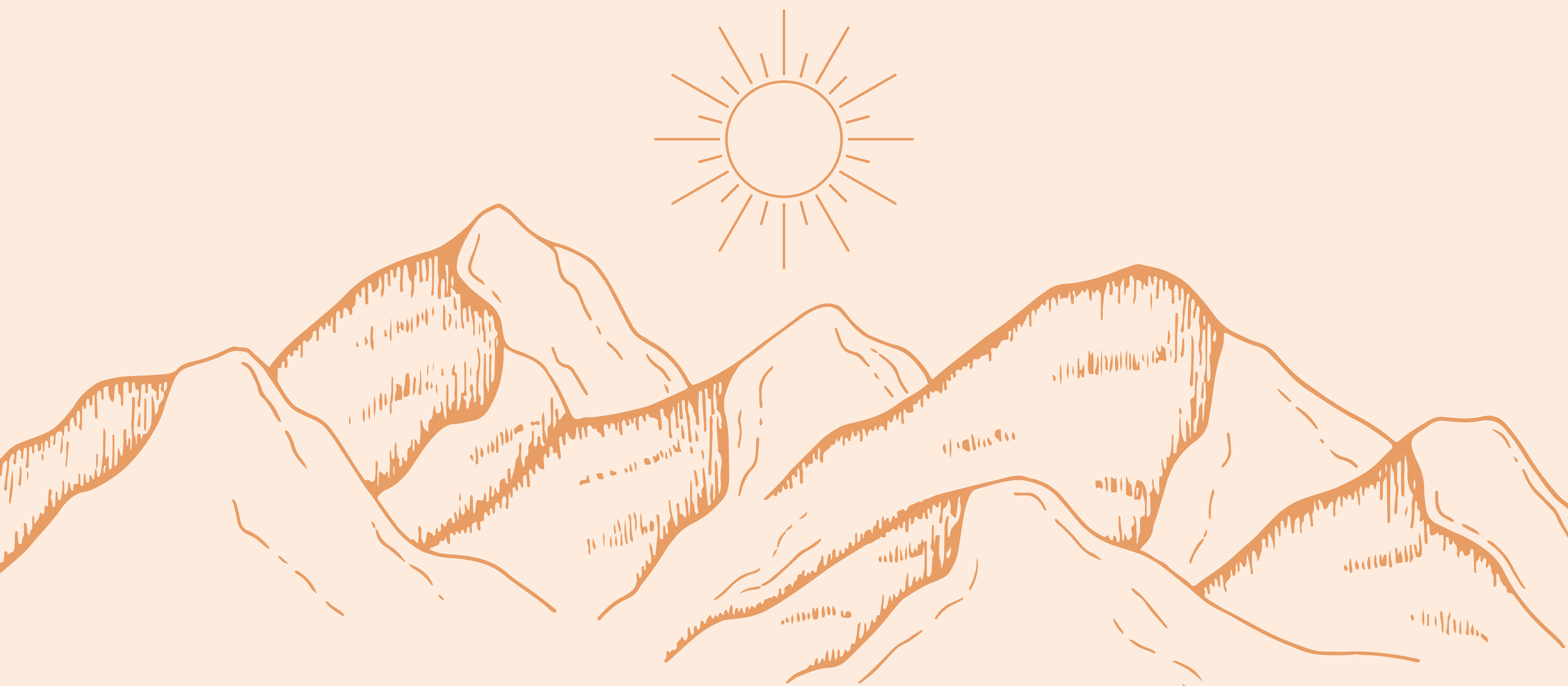

Riveting Reads

There are many important aspects of a novel to think of while you are reading. When the novel was written. When the novel is set. When the novel was set. What viewpoint and bias you are reading with. All of these aspects are important when you consume literature. It can change the meaning and your reaction to it. Your reality is defined by what you know and your interpretation of that knowledge. If you read a novel through a certain lens, you will be more aware of that perspective and therefore will change what interpretation you take away from it. If you read a novel with a certain perception, it will change what information you learn. Therefore affecting your biases to certain types of literature.



Understanding is based primarily on personal historical context. If you understand full historical context of the setting and place the novel is set and the context of the life of the author, it is possible to retain and gain a deeper understanding of the text.

However, having full historical context and knowledge of how and why and when and where the novel was written, does not mean you will ever truly understand the intention of the author. For example, in the book Fahrenheit 451 the main interpretation is not the one that the author intended. Therefore understanding intention and understanding and interpreted meaning with context are very different things.

It is also important to know that you can't ever understand the context of every piece of media you consume. Alas, endeavouring to have understanding of some of the media and literature you consume is important. Understanding that when you are reading a complex and multifaceted piece of literature, you can't possibly know truly what the intention and complex meaning of everything. You shouldn't let the 'intended' perception of a novel affect how you interpret it and the message you take away from it. However, some things are factually incorrect and can be corrected with understanding of setting and place, and historical context.



In conclusion, enjoy what you read. Understand some context and some meaning and you'll be alright. Literature is an opportunity. It is important that you grasp that opportunity on the best foot.

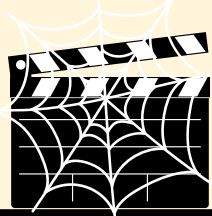


FILM REVIEW: GREASE
